

New Bible Study on Wednesdays on the book of Genesis




Next session Wednesday October 16th at 7PM in-person at Emanuel

Opening Devotions

Minutes: Motion to accept the July 2024 minutes Pastor Todd Seconded by Bruce Motion to accept the August 2024 minutes Pastor Todd Seconded by Bruce

Treasurer's Report/Finance Committee: Carol Johnson was present to answer questions. Substitutes for Nancy will increase staffing costs this year.

Custodial will probably be under budget.

FICA should also be under budget.

Facilities is right on track except for insurance, which went up 28%. Part of what drives it up is due to increased property value. Carol has spoken to an agent who said that raising the deductible won't make much of a difference. She is now paying the package monthly. She anticipates that it will be \$1200 a month in September. Carol is trying to get information from Church Mutual in order to try and bid out the insurance, but she has had difficulty getting this information.

Maintenance will probably exceed the budget.

Telephone also increased slightly, but will probably increase next year.

Programs is fine.

Admin is low.

Outreach has gone down because of Joyful Noise. Emanuel gave money to Joyful Noise out of the Endowment fund this year. Outreach in the budget does not include endowment monies.

June income was high because there were five Sundays in the month. We are still seeing growth in the endowment funds. We have \$8,174.98 in earmarked funds. Food pantry currently has \$13,581.64.

Myron suggested that the parking lot money be used somewhere else, but the endowment committee wanted it to stay in that fund.

Ellie's Circle funds will now be listed under Earmarked Funds.

We will be looking at formulating the 2025 budget in the near future.

Christian Education: We started Sunday School and Confirmation last Sunday. Only three attended Confirmation.

Property: The retaining wall was completed other than the uprights. No other questions. There were a good number of people who helped with this project.

Solar: All questions were answered at the Finance Committee. We may need a larger transformer or downsize the solar. Myron is going to see the Joyful Noise Board next week. If they don't agree with the solar project, we will charge them the going rate for 80% of the total cost. Myron stated that Jen is in agreement with the solar project. We have not yet

approached a bank about the \$80K loan. Myron would like to have the project completed this coming Spring. This would allow us to bank the extra energy (more sun in the summer). Myron would like to hold a congregational meeting to vote on this in November. The proposed date suggested by the Council for the meeting is November 17th.

Safe Church: Myron would like the training to be held soon. Todd suggested Tuesday, September 24th for this training.

Worship and Music: Nancy will be out for three Sundays following her surgery. Choir practice will probably start in a month. Chuck will be substituting for Nancy. Our worship attendance is up from last year.

Church Directory: Bruce will follow up with this. Myron suggested that we find out who the daycare used for pictures this year. We can also update everyone's contact information at that time. LifeTouch no longer does directories. We used them last time. Sue has provided some information to Bruce in regard to possible companies to take on this project.

Bible Readings for Sunday October 6th

First Reading

1st Samuel 1:2, 4-18

Hannah is unable to have children. She is tormented internally and externally by this. In her anguish she comes to God in prayer.

- ² [Elkanah] had two wives; the name of one was Hannah, and the name of the other Peninnah. Peninnah had children, but Hannah had no children.
- ⁴On the day when Elkanah sacrificed, he would give portions to his wife Peninnah and to all her sons and daughters; ⁵but to Hannah he gave a double portion, because he loved her, though the Lord had closed her womb. ⁶Her rival used to provoke her severely, to irritate her, because the Lord had closed her womb. ⁷So it went on year after year; as often as she went up to the house of the Lord, she used to provoke her. Therefore Hannah wept and would not eat. ⁸Her husband Elkanah said to her, 'Hannah, why do you weep? Why do you not eat? Why is your heart sad? Am I not more to you than ten sons?'
- ⁹ After they had eaten and drunk at Shiloh, Hannah rose and presented herself before the Lord. Now Eli the priest was sitting on the seat beside the doorpost of the temple of the Lord. ¹⁰She was deeply distressed and prayed to the Lord, and wept bitterly. ¹¹She made this vow: 'O Lord of hosts, if only you will look on the misery of your servant, and remember me, and not forget your servant, but will give to your servant a male child, then I will set him before you as a nazirite until the day of his death. He shall drink neither wine nor intoxicants, and no razor shall touch his head.'
- ¹² As she continued praying before the Lord, Eli observed her mouth. ¹³Hannah was praying silently; only her lips moved, but her voice was not heard; therefore Eli thought she was drunk. ¹⁴So Eli said to her, 'How long will you make a drunken spectacle of yourself? Put away your wine.' ¹⁵But Hannah answered, 'No, my lord, I am a woman deeply troubled; I have drunk neither wine nor strong drink, but I have been pouring out my soul before the Lord. ¹⁶Do not regard your servant as a worthless woman, for I have been speaking out of my great anxiety and vexation all this time.' ¹⁷Then Eli answered, 'Go in peace; the God of Israel grant the petition you have made to him.' ¹⁸And she said, 'Let your servant find favor in your sight.' Then the woman went to her quarters, ate and drank with her husband, and her countenance was sad no longer.

Second Reading

1st Samuel 1:19-20, 2:1-11

God grants Hannah's prayer and she bears a son, Samuel. Hannah responds with what is known as "Hannah's Song". Samuel will become the last of Israel's judges, and will anoint the first two kings of Israel, Saul and David.

¹⁹ [Hannah and Elkanah] rose early in the morning and worshipped before the Lord; then they went back to their house at Ramah. Elkanah knew his wife Hannah, and the Lord remembered her. ²⁰In due time Hannah conceived and bore a son. She named him Samuel, for she said, 'I have asked him of the Lord.'

¹ Hannah prayed and said,

'My heart exults in the Lord; my strength is exalted in my God. My mouth derides my enemies,

because I rejoice in my victory.

- ² 'There is no Holy One like the Lord, no one besides you; there is no Rock like our God.
- ³ Talk no more so very proudly, let not arrogance come from your mouth;

for the Lord is a God of knowledge, and by him actions are weighed.

- ⁴ The bows of the mighty are broken, but the feeble gird on strength.
- ⁵ Those who were full have hired themselves out for bread, but those who were hungry are fat with spoil.

The barren has borne seven,

but she who has many children is forlorn.

- 6 The Lord kills and brings to life; he brings down to Sheol and raises up.
- ⁷ The Lord makes poor and makes rich; he brings low, he also exalts.
- 8 He raises up the poor from the dust; he lifts the needy from the ash heap, to make them sit with princes and inherit a seat of honor. For the pillars of the earth are the Lord's, and on them he has set the world.



- 9 'He will guard the feet of his faithful ones, but the wicked shall be cut off in darkness; for not by might does one prevail.
- 10 The Lord! His adversaries shall be shattered; the Most High will thunder in heaven.

The Lord will judge the ends of the earth; he will give strength to his king, and exalt the power of his anointed.'

¹¹ Then Elkanah went home to Ramah, while the boy remained to minister to the Lord, in the presence of the priest Eli.

Upcoming Commemorations

Teresa of Avila, teacher, renewer of the church, died 1582 Tuesday, October 15, 2024

A mystical writer and reformer of the monastic order (Carmelites) to which she belonged, Teresa may also be commemorated with John of the Cross on December 14. Latino Christians traditionally remember her on this date.

Ignatius, Bishop of Antioch, martyr, died around 115 Thursday, October 17, 2024

Ignatius was the second bishop of Antioch in Syria, the city where the name "Christians" originated. Ignatius is known to us from his letters, which encouraged Christians to live in love, yet stand firm in true doctrine.

Luke, Evangelist Friday, October 18, 2024

Identified as the author of both Luke and Acts, Luke was careful to place the events of Jesus' life in their social and religious contexts. His gospel gives us some of the most beloved parables, as well as the songs of Zechariah, Mary, the angels, and Simeon.
