





#### Emanuel Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes November 14, 2024

**Opening Devotions** Pastor Todd

**Minutes:** Motion to accept the October Council minutes by Pastor Todd. Seconded by Bruce

**Treasurer's Report/Finance Committee:** Income was \$18K last month and expenditures were also \$18K. Thrivent Endowment account went down last month because of negative monthly earnings and growth (-\$2,089.56). YTD we have had an increase of \$8,843.87 in the Thrivent Main account. YTD earnings and growth is \$21,678.00. Total earmarked items amount to \$8,131. We have underspent the budget by \$7,200.00. Carol was unable to find cheaper insurance than Church Mutual, so we will remain with them in the coming year.

**Finance** would like Council to reconsider the matter regarding feedback on the video. There was some discussion by the Council regarding this matter. The Lay Minister and the Pastor should turn off their mikes when singing so as not to overpower the congregation during songs. There was some discussion about purchasing a different kind of mike to pick up the choir when they sing. Myron will look into the cost of this. Perhaps the quality on YouTube would be better. We would need to look into the cost of YouTube.

**Christian Ed Committee:** The was a decision made to have the Christmas Pageant at the 10:30 service the Sunday before Christmas (December 22<sup>nd</sup>). It was suggested by the committee that the Christmas Eve service be moved to 9:00 PM versus the usual 11:00 PM. Pastor will send out a survey to determine the time of the service on Christmas Eve. Confirmation classes have spotty attendance, with two Sundays having no confirmands in attendance. There was a discussion about the commitment needed to be a confirmand. Marge and Sue think that they should have a discussion with the kids about this. Pastor will follow up with this and report out at the Council meeting next month.

**Property Committee:** Myron got a quote for landscaping – to cut grass is \$75 a cut at \$300 a month and will be \$400 a cut for the landscaping (New London side), which will be on a yearly basis. Myron will continue to seek out quotes. There will be a cemetery cleanup the last Saturday in November. Michael will make up some slides for the solar meeting after church. There was a discussion about replacing the boiler (around \$15,000). There is better efficiency with the boiler type we have now. If the boiler breaks down, it could take three weeks to replace it. That would be a problem in the winter as the day care would need to be shut down during that time. If it breaks down in the spring, they would not necessarily have to shut down the day care. Myron is going to look for a replacement janitor for the church,

**Worship and Music:** The Tuesday before Thanksgiving there will be a church service at Pilgrim Lutheran Church. Pastor will be giving the sermon. There will be a Holden Evening Prayer service on December 15<sup>th</sup>. The Epiphany service will take place this year and we will be inviting other churches to join us. Choir has started up again and they are now singing on Sundays.

The Bazaar went very well. We made \$5615.00 plus some additional monies still owed. The bake sale made \$500 more than last year, nearly \$1700. The raffle made over \$2000. Pastor went to the new Bishop's convocation this last week. There are congregations in the Synod who have licensed lay ministers. They act in the stead of Pastors.


The next meeting is on December 12th and will be held at the Wieboldt's home at 6:00.

## Are You Interested in Giving?



#### Bible Readings for Sunday December 22<sup>nd</sup>

First Reading Luke 1:26-38

Jesus' birth is foretold. God's promise from centuries before will be fulfilled in an unwed, young woman from a small town.

<sup>26</sup> In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, <sup>27</sup>to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. <sup>28</sup>And he came to her and said, 'Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you.' 29But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. 30The angel said to her, 'Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. <sup>31</sup>And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. 32He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. <sup>33</sup>He will reign over the house of Jacob for ever, and of his kingdom there will be no end.' <sup>34</sup>Mary said to the angel, 'How can this be, since I am a virgin?' <sup>35</sup>The angel said to her, 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God. <sup>36</sup>And now, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son; and this is the sixth month for her who was said to be barren. <sup>37</sup>For nothing will be impossible with God.' <sup>38</sup>Then Mary said, 'Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word.' Then the angel departed from her.

#### **Second Reading**

Luke 1:39-56

Elizabeth, John the Baptist's mother, and Mary, the mother of Jesus, two women filled with the Holy Spirit and with faith. In Elizabeth's inspired greeting and Mary's song of praise we hear of a saving God who remembers, scatters, lifts up, and fulfills all things.

<sup>39</sup> In those days Mary set out and went with haste to a Judean town in the hill country, <sup>40</sup>where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. <sup>41</sup>When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leapt in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit <sup>42</sup>and exclaimed with a loud cry, 'Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. <sup>43</sup>And why has this happened to me, that the mother of my Lord comes to me? <sup>44</sup>For as soon as I heard the sound of your greeting, the child in my womb leapt for joy. <sup>45</sup>And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfilment of what was spoken to her by the Lord.'





- <sup>52</sup> He has brought down the powerful from their thrones, and lifted up the lowly;
- <sup>53</sup> he has filled the hungry with good things, and sent the rich away empty.
- <sup>54</sup> He has helped his servant Israel, in remembrance of his mercy,
- <sup>55</sup> according to the promise he made to our ancestors, to Abraham and to his descendants for ever.'
- <sup>56</sup> And Mary remained with her for about three months and then returned to her home.

# Katharina von Bora Luther, renewer of the church, died 1552 Friday, December 20, 2024

Born to an impoverished nobleman, Katie eventually took vows as a nun, but around age twenty-four she and several other nuns who were influenced by the writings of Martin Luther left the convent. Six children were born to Katie and Martin.

#### Stephen, Deacon and Martyr Thursday, December 26, 2024

Stephen was a deacon and the first martyr of the church. He was one of those seven upon whom the apostles laid hands after they had been chosen to serve widows and others in need. Later, Stephen's preaching angered the temple authorities, and they ordered him to be put to death by stoning.

# John, Apostle and Evangelist Friday, December 27, 2024

The son of Zebedee and brother of James, John was one of the twelve disciples and witness to the transfiguration. Tradition has named him also the writer of the Gospel of John, the three New Testament letters bearing his name, as well as Revelation.

#### The Holy Innocents, Martyrs Saturday, December 28, 2024

This day commemorates the young children killed by Herod in Bethlehem in his jealous attempt to murder the baby Jesus, a sobering reminder of the evil that led Christ to be born for our salvation.
